


## Collective Nouns for Animals

Collective nouns are words that we use to describe *a group of people, animals or things*, when referring to them as *one singular thing*. For example, a football team is made up of many players, but we would say that the team '**is** moving up in the league' (referring to the team as third person singular, 'it', rather than plural 'they are...'.)


