

Suffix -ed

Pronunciation



You may see the suffix '-ed' in the past tense of regular verbs, past participles and adjectives.

The pronunciation of words ending in -ed depends on the **final sound** (not spelling) of the base word. Depending on the type of sound we can pronounce '-ed' as /id/ /t/ or /d/.

/t/ after unvoiced consonants	/d/ after vowels and voiced consonants	/ɪd/ after /t/ or /d/

Voiced consonants are sounds that we make with the vocal cords vibrating alongside our mouth and breath.

Unvoiced consonants are made without the vocal cords vibrating.

If you're not sure if a sound is voiced or unvoiced you can check by putting your hand on your throat.
